"Internationalization strategies of Chinese MNEs in TMT Sector"

Background

While many sectors have been severely impacted by the coronavirus, for Technology, Media and Telecom sector (TMT), certain companies even achieved positive growth during the pandemic. For example, Amazon doubles quarterly profits despite Covid costs (Financial Times, 2020). Furthermore, in Chinese market, due to the rapid growth in both domestic and foreign markets, firms such as Baidu, Alibaba, Tencent ("BAT") have been under the spotlight by many reports across the world. However, the current study regarding the internationalization pattern of this particular sector is still limited. Hence, several questions following might be interesting to answer. Do they pursue same growth pattern as Chinese MNEs from other sectors? If these firms choose to cross-invest in oversea market, what can be the motivations behind? What if they have already internationalized, are they successful? Why?
